Hot Air Balloon Festival

On the 14th and 15th of September the hot air balloon festival brought dozens of hot air balloons right outside our front door, to the Richard B. Russell Airport. For two days families enjoyed tethered balloon rides, crafts, vendors, kids rides, and even aerial stunts by the Tiger Flight Foundation. Balloons included beloved childhood characters; the Purple People Eater, Tom & Jerry, Pepe Le Pew, Tweety Bird & Sylvester. The Museum of Flight also had the full catalog of aircrafts displayed for the public to enjoy. Museum Curator, Cecilia Ratke's, Smithsonian Internship

Museum Curator, Cecilia Ratke, had the extraordinary opportunity to participate in a 10 week Smithsonian internship. Cecilia's main project was working with a collection of fish illustrations that was donated to the National Museum of Natural History (NMNH) in 2016 from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA).

The illustrations were mostly pen and ink illustrations by Jack C. Javech created between 1983 and 2004. Cecilia was tasked with going through the illustrations, rehousing, and cataloguing them. Rehousing them involved removing any extra paper flaps, staples, or tape on the illustrations that would damage them over time. She then put the illustrations in individual archival folders for storage. Cataloguing them involved giving each illustration a catalog number so that it became an official member of the Fish Illustration Collection. Finally, Cecilia added information about the piece (e.g. date, artist, art medium, species of fish) to the NMNH's Fish Illustration Database.

Cecilia also had the opportunity to tour the collections of some different departments at the NMNH. She remembered the Meteorite Collection as being particularly notable. She was able to hold meteorites from the moon and from Mars! Another highlight was the Marine Mammals collection, where she saw the skull of a Blue Whale which was at least 3 times as tall as her.

Cecilia experienced firsthand how large museums catalog their collection and keep track of everything they have. The NMNH has over 126 million items, and the Fish Illustration Collection has over 27,000 illustrations, so keeping track of it all is a huge endeavor. Cecilia plans to further streamline her method of cataloging the Museum of Flight's collection based on the new methods she learned, emphasizing the ability to find the item over an exhaustive description of it. She also learned the value of taking care of film and paper, which will guide her efforts to upgrade museum displays, while preserving the items for the future. The museum is lucky to have Cecilia on the team, her dedication and talents have already been a huge help in furthering the MOF cause.
