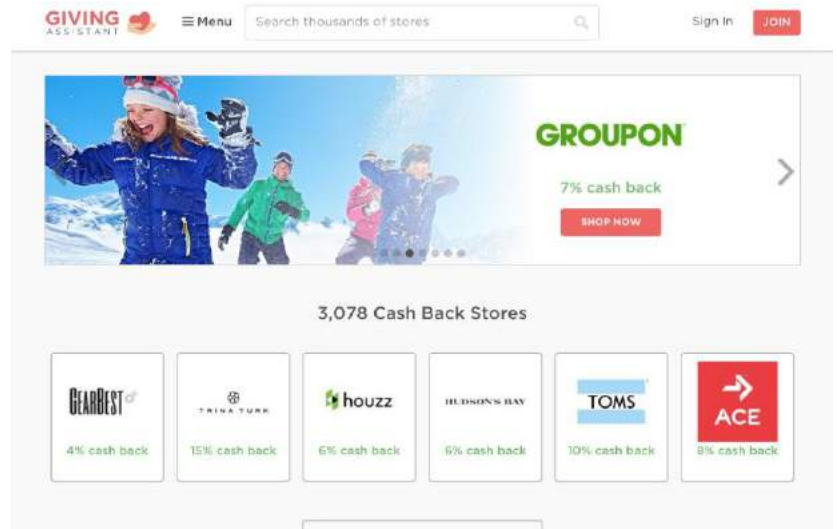


Donate to the Museum Through Purchases You Already Make

Museum Spotlight: The Story of the F4U Corsair

In a world that feels like it is becoming more divisive, a donation from Fred Amicangioli reminds us of the true American spirit. Amicangioli recently gave the museum a signed F4U Corsair, now proudly displayed in the ready room. Yet, this F4U Corsair is more than just a heavy-duty carrier-based aircraft. The plane represents the stories of Captain Thomas Hinder and Ensign Jesse Brown, two American heroes.

Hudner, a child of privilege, was born in Massachusetts, where he attended the Phillips Academy before attending United States Naval Academy. Hinder started flying the F4U Corsair as part of Fighter Squadron 32. Hudner flew support missions from the aircraft carrier, USS Leyte after arriving near Korea in October 1950.

Brown's childhood could not have further contrasted Hudner's. Born to a poor family in Mississippi, he graduated as salutatorian of his high school, later being awarded with a degree from Ohio State University. Brown enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 1946, becoming a midshipman. On October 21st, 1948 he became the first African-American aviator in the U.S. Navy. He was assigned to Fighter Squadron 32 aboard the aircraft carrier USS Leyte, where he would meet Hudner.

On December 4th, 1950 during the heat of the Battle of Chosin, Brown's F4U Corsair took fire and crashed on a remote mountaintop while supporting ground troops. Hudner intentionally crashed his own plane in an attempt to save Brown from his burning aircraft. Unfortunately, Brown succumbed to his injuries and Hudner was forced to evacuate. Hudner's heroic efforts that day earned him the Medal of Honor.
