

The National Commercial Aviation Museum in Atlanta donated a 1951 CO2 flight line fire extinguisher. With the help of David Ball, the fire extinguisher has been fully restored. The extinguisher would be used on or around the C45 in the 1950s. These two complementary pieces of technology work together to create a perfect replica of the period they belong to. They serve as a sort of time machine into aviation's past. The extinguisher acting as a reminder that safety is and always has been as big of a part of aviation as the aircraft themselves.

### Open Hangar Gala






